Recipes Using Essential Oils

HARVEST SALAD

1# Pasta of your choice
1 1/2 cups Cherry Tomatoes, halved
1 1/2 cups Cucumber, sliced and cubed

1/4 cup Red Onion, thinly sliced

Dressing:

1/2 cup Olive Oil

4 tbls. Red Wine Vinegar

1 tsp. Garlic, minced

1/2 tsp. Salt

1/4 tsp. Pepper

2 drops Lemon EO

1 toothpick Basil EO

1 toothpick Oregano EO

Cook the pasta according to the package instructions, drain and rinse with cold water and set aside.

Vigorously whisk the olive oil, vinegar, garlic, salt, pepper, and essential oils in a large bowl.

Stir the pasta and vegetables into the dressing until coated. Taste and add additional salt and pepper if needed.

Refrigerate for 30 minutes.

Stir and top with parmesan cheese and fresh julienned basil before serving.

MAPLE VANILLA PECANS

12 tbls. pure Maple Syrup10 drops Madagascar Vanilla1/4 tsp. Salt1 1/2 tsp. Water2 cups Pecans, halved

Combine the maple syrup, vanilla, salt, and water in a small bowl and set aside.

In a saucepan, toast the pecans over medium heat for three to four minutes until fragrant. Stir consistently to prevent burning. Remove the pecans from the heat, drizzle with the maple syrup mixture, and stir until the pecans are thoroughly coated. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper, spread the coated pecans in an even layer on the baking sheet, and place in the refrigerator to cool.

Add to your favorite salad and store excess in an airtight container.

Empty Containers

Herbs

Soil

Stain (optional)

Screws

Decide where you want the jars to hang on your board, then screw them on.

Fill the jars with soil and transplant the herbs to the jars.

Label each jar with the names of the herbs.
